EARLY GRADUATION

All students are required to enroll in a minimum of five or four full-time subjects each school year.

At the conclusion of the sophomore year, the student and parent or guardian who desire to graduate at the completion of three years will apply to the high school administration, in writing, that they wish early graduation. A letter of request should indicate the student's educational and/or technical objectives and reasons the student would benefit from the early graduation. Consideration for each student's proposal will be determined by scholastic standing, school attendance record, teachers' recommendations, age of the student, and parents' concurrence.

The student, parent, or guardian will have a conference with principal and/or assistant principal and/or guidance counselor to discuss the reason this request is being made.

The student will be awarded a high school diploma at the conclusion of the student's junior year if all courses are successfully completed.

The School Committee will receive in May of each year from the principal, the names of each student who has requested early graduation along with his/her recommendation and the complete information necessary to evaluate the proposal for the final determination of the request.

A student who is admitted to an early graduation program must maintain satisfactory standards of effort, achievement and school citizenship during the final school year.
